

EA/ED 101

Deadlines are normally between November 1st and December 15th



- Binding. Students must go.
- Can only opt to not go if the financial aid package does not fit students' budget.
- Can only apply to one ED school.
 - If accepted, must formally withdraw all other applications.
- Must deposit shortly after acceptance (between 14-30 days).



- Non-Binding.
- Can apply to more than one.
- Can deposit by May 1st.
- Note there is a restricted early action as well (REA) where you can only apply to ONE school early, but not bound to attend if accepted.

Is ED/EA for me?

- 1. Will you complete all applications, essays, financial aid and receive a letter of recommendations between November 1-15th?
- 2.1s this school one that you researched and is your absolute first choice?
- 3. Are your grades strong from your first 3 years of high school?
- 4. Does your GPA reflect a similar GPA to the average for their first-year enrollment?
- 5. Are your completed test scores (SAT/ACT) close to or above the average for their first-year enrollment?
- 6. Is this school an academic, social and financial fit?
- 7. Have you visited the campus or attended a virtual info session?

If you answered NO to any of these questions, you should do EA and not ED.

If you answered YES to those questions, please answer the following to see if you should do ED:

- 1. If you are to get into the school, are you okay with not knowing about the fate of your other options?
- 2. Are you able to submit a deposit after getting in within 15 days of notification?

If you answered YES to BOTH of these questions, you can consider doing ED.
